Exception: anxious</p> <p><b>Year 5 words</b> Government, Soldier, Sacrifice, Bruise, Parliament Forty, Twelfth, Excellent, Secretary</p>	<p>Words ending in –ant, –ance/–ancy, –ent, –ence/–ency Examples: observant, observance, (observation), expectant (expectation), hesitant, hesitancy (hesitation), tolerant, tolerance (toleration), substance (substantial) innocent, innocence, decent, decency, frequent, frequency, confident, confidence (confidential) assistant, assistance, obedient, obedience, independent, independence</p> <p><b>Year 6 words</b> Stomach, Muscle, Conscience, Conscious, Explanation, Necessary, Shoulder, sufficient, nuisance, hindrance, convenience</p>
<b>Autumn 2</b>	<p>The suffix –ly including root words which end in le and lc Examples: gently, simply, basically, frantically The suffix – ation Examples: information, sensation, decoration, donation</p> <p><b>Year 3 words</b> Fruit, Extreme, Group, Library, Purpose, Address, Earth, Natural, Actual(ly), Accident(ally), Probably</p>	<p>Words with endings sounding like ʒə or tʃə (sure or ture) Examples: measure, treasure, creature nature etc. Endings which sound like ʒən (sion) Examples: television, division, invasion etc.</p> <p><b>Year 4 words</b> Occasion(ally), Calendar, Early, Enough, Sentence, Remember, Pressure, Grammar</p>	<p>Endings which sound like fəl spelt –cial or –tial Examples: official, special, artificial, partial, confidential, essential. Exceptions include: initial, financial, commercial, provincial (the spelling of the last three is clearly related to finance, commerce and province).</p> <p><b>Year 5 words</b> Especially, Accommodate, According, Communicate, Community, Equipped, Equipment, Symbol, System</p>	<p>Words ending in –able and –ible and in –ably and –ibly Examples: adorable/adorably (adoration), applicable/applicably (application), considerable/considerably (consideration), tolerable/tolerably (toleration) changeable, noticeable, forcible, legible dependable, comfortable, understandable, reasonable, enjoyable, reliable possible/possibly, horrible/horribly,terrible/terribly,</p>

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				<p>visible/visibly, incredible/incredibly, sensible/sensibly</p> <p><b>Year 6 words</b> Available, Vehicle, Leisure, Accompany, Variety, Privilege Achieve, Aggressive, Amateur, Occupy, Occur</p>
<p><b>Spring 1</b></p>	<p>Adding suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable Examples: forgetting, forgotten, beginning, beginner, prefer, preferred, gardener, gardening, limiting, limitation</p> <p><b>Year 3 words</b> February, Breath, Breathe, Ordinary, Regular, Strange, Peculiar, Opposite,</p>	<p>The suffix –ous Examples: famous, dangerous, courageous, glamorous, serious obvious etc. Words with the /eɪ/ sound spelt ei, eigh, or ey Examples: vein, weigh, eight, obey</p> <p><b>Year 4 words</b> Various, Famous, Notice, Naughty, Promise, Imagine, Increase, Favourite, Weight</p>	<p>Words with ‘silent’ letters (i.e. letters whose presence cannot be predicted from the pronunciation of the word) Examples: doubt, island, lamb, solemn, thistle, knight</p> <p><b>Year 5 words</b> Sincere, Sincerely, Signature, Temperature, Vegetable, Identity, Individual, Immediate, Immediately</p>	<p>Use of the hyphen Examples: co-ordinate, re-enter, co-operate, co-own</p> <p><b>Year 6 words</b> Rhythm, Rhyme, Queue, Determined, Disastrous,</p>
<p><b>Spring 2</b></p>	<p>The i sound spelt y elsewhere than at the end of words Examples: myth, gym, Egypt, pyramid, mystery The /ʌ/ sound spelt ou Examples: young, touch, double, trouble, country</p> <p><b>Year 3 words</b> Quarter, Length, Straight, Heard, Heart, Height, Guard, Guide</p>	<p>Endings which sound like ʃən (tion, sion, ssion, cian) Examples: invention, action, expression, tension, magician etc.</p> <p><b>Year 4 words</b> Question, Position, Mention, Different, Difficult, Consider, Continue, Reign,</p>	<p>Words containing the letter-string ough Examples: ought, bought, thought, nought, brought, fought rough, tough, enough, cough, though, although, dough through, thorough, borough, plough, bough</p> <p><b>Year 5 words</b> Thorough, Ancient, Language, Competition, Attached, Average, Bargain, Physical</p>	<p>Words with the /i:/ sound spelt ei after c Examples deceive, conceive, receive, perceive, ceiling Exceptions: protein, caffeine, seize</p> <p><b>Year 6 words</b> Controversy, Correspond, Criticise, Exaggerate, Existence, Interrupt, Curiosity, Awkward, Cemetery, Committee</p>

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<p><b>Summer 1</b></p>	<p>Words with the /k/ sound spelt ch Examples: scheme, chorus, echo etc. Words with the j sound spelt ch Examples: chef, machine, brochure etc.</p> <p><b><u>Year 3 words</u></b> Minute, Experiment, Answer, Arrive, Believe, Popular, Perhaps, Busy, Business</p>	<p>Words ending with the g sound spelt gue and the k sound spelt que Examples: tongue, league, antique, unique etc. Words with the s sound spelt sc Example: science, scene, crescent etc.</p> <p><b><u>Year 4 words</u></b> Material, Particular, Possible, Forward, Regular, Strength, Suppose, Surprise</p>	<p>Adding suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words ending in –fer Examples: referring, referred, referral, preferring, preferred, transferring, transferred reference, referee, preference, transference.</p> <p><b><u>Year 5 words</u></b> Category, Frequently, Marvellous, Neighbour, Desperate, Dictionary, Definite, Develop, Suggest</p>	<p>Homophones and other words that are often confused: advice/advise device/devise licence/license practice/practise prophecy/prophesy very heavy (as heavy as lead) morning: before noon mourning: grieving for someone who has died past: noun or adjective referring to a previous time (e.g. In the past) or preposition or adverb showing place (e.g. he walked past me) passed: past tense of the verb ‘pass’ (e.g. I passed him in the road) precede: go in front of or before proceed: go on</p> <p><b><u>Year 6 words</u></b> Yacht, Environment, Lightning, Foreign, Opportunity, Appreciate, Apparent, Recommend, Mischievous</p>
<p><b>Summer 2</b></p>	<p>Possessive apostrophes in plural words Examples: girls’, boys’, babies’ etc.</p> <p><b><u>Year 3 words</u></b> Possession, Caught, Though, Although, Through, Thought, Therefore, Potatoes</p>	<p>Homophones and near homophones: ball/bawl, berry/bury, brake/break, fair/fare, grate/great, groan/grown, here/hear, heel/heal/he’ll, knot/not, mail/male, main/mane, meat/meet, medal/meddle, missed/mist, peace/piece, plain/plane, rain/rein/reign, scene/seen, weather/whether, whose/who’s</p> <p><b><u>Year 4 words</u></b> Medicine, Experience, Island, Separate Exercise, Special, Woman/Women,</p>	<p>Homophones and other words that are often confused: farther: further father: a male parent guessed: past tense of the verb guess guest: visitor heard: past tense of the verb hear herd: a group of animal led: past tense of the verb lead lead: present tense of that verb, or else the metal which is very heavy (as heavy as lead)</p> <p><b><u>Year 5 words</u></b> Familiar, Interfere, Persuade, Profession, Programme, Recognise, Relevant, Restaurant</p>	<p>Consolidation of all spelling rules covered within Year 6 and secure application within writing.</p>
